

CANDY CORN CROCHET PATTERN

Materials Needed for This Candy Corn Crochet Pattern



Yarn:

- **White** (top section)
- **Orange** (middle section)
- **Yellow** (bottom section)

I like to use worsted weight acrylic yarn, but cotton works beautifully too if you prefer a firmer finish. If you're unsure about yarn sizing, my [yarn weight gauge hook size guide](#) will help you match your yarn and hook perfectly.

🔍 Crochet Hook:

- 3.0 mm to 3.5 mm hook for a snug stitch (important so the stuffing doesn't peek through).

👁️ Safety Eyes or Embroidery Thread:

- Optional, if you want to turn your **crochet pattern for candy corn** into an adorable amigurumi character.

Extras:

- Yarn needle for sewing in ends
- Scissors
- Stitch marker (especially helpful if you're still new to working in the round)
- Polyester fiberfill stuffing

Step-by-Step Crochet Pattern for Candy Corn

White Top Section

1. **R1:** MR, 6 sc (6)
2. **R2:** (sc, inc) \times 3 \rightarrow (9)
3. **R3:** (2 sc, inc) \times 3 \rightarrow (12)
4. **R4–5:** sc around (12)



Orange Middle Section

1. Switch to orange yarn — if you've never changed colors smoothly, check out my [changing colors in amigurumi tutorial](#).
2. **R6:** (3 sc, inc) × 3 → (15)
3. **R7–9:** sc around (15)



Yellow Bottom Section

1. Switch to yellow yarn.
2. **R10:** (4 sc, inc) × 3 → (18)
3. **R11–12:** sc around (18)
4. Stuff your piece firmly, but not so much that the stitches stretch.
5. **R13:** (sc, dec) × 6 → (12)
6. **R14:** dec × 6 → (6)
7. Fasten off and weave in ends.





👁️ Add the Face

- Attach safety eyes between R6 and R7, about 5 stitches apart.
- Use black embroidery thread to stitch a smile between the eyes.
- For a cute blush effect, lightly apply a bit of pink yarn or felt circles.



Play with Colors

Who says candy corn has to be yellow, orange, and white? Try pastels for spring, bold neons for summer, or even black-and-purple for a spooky twist. If you're experimenting with unusual yarn blends, my [yarn weight gauge hook size guide](#) will help you pick the perfect hook size.
