

Labubu Clothes Crochet Pattern (Free)

3-piece outfit set: Hood Hat (ear holes + ties + pom-poms) • Earmuffs • Overalls (pocket + straps)



Written in US crochet terms. Fit depends on yarn and tension; use the quick adjustments inside.

Skill level	Beginner-friendly (basic sc, hdc, dc)
Yarn	DK / Light Worsted (#3) cotton or cotton-blend
Hook	3.0–3.5 mm (use 3.0 if you crochet loose; 3.5 if you crochet tight)
Colors	White/Cream + Pastel Purple/Mauve (optional Red/Coral variation)
Notions	2 small buttons (6–8 mm), yarn needle, scissors, stitch markers

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1) Materials, Abbreviations & Notes

Yarn: Smooth cotton or cotton-blend with good stitch definition. Yarn weight: DK / Light Worsted (Category #3).

Colors: White/Cream (hood, ties, pocket) + Pastel Purple/Mauve (overalls, earmuffs, trim). Optional variation: Red/Coral instead of purple.

Hook: 3.0–3.5 mm. Use 3.0 mm if you crochet loose; 3.5 mm if you crochet tight.

Notions: 2 small buttons (6–8 mm), yarn needle, scissors, stitch markers.

US Abbreviations

- MR = magic ring
- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- inc = increase (2 sts in same st)
- dec = decrease (dc2tog or sc2tog as noted)
- BLO = back loop only

Notes

- Hood rounds are joined with sl st.
- ch2 does NOT count as a stitch unless stated.
- Fit depends on yarn and tension; adjust chains when needed.
- Use stitch markers to track the start of rounds and the overalls leg split (20 front / 20 back).

2) A) Hood Hat (White) with Ear Holes + Ties + Pom-Poms

Work the hood crown in joined rounds of dc, then shape the back with turning rows.



Hood Crown (joined rounds in dc)

R1: MR, 12 dc, join with sl st (12)
R2: ch2, inc dc in each st around, join (24)
R3: ch2, (dc, inc dc) x 12, join (36)
R4: ch2, (2 dc, inc dc) x 12, join (48)

Ear holes round

R5: ch2, dc 20, ch 5, skip 5 sts, dc 3, ch 5, skip 5 sts, dc 15, join.
You now have 2 ear holes made by the ch-5 spaces.

Back of hood shaping (turning rows)

Now crochet only the back section.

Row 6: ch2, turn, dc 37 (37) Row 7: ch2, turn, dec 1 dc at each side (dc2tog at start + dc2tog at end) = 35 dc
Row 8: ch2, turn, dec 1 dc at each side = 33 dc
Row 9: ch1, turn, sc 33 (33). Fasten off.

Ties (make 2)

- Join yarn at one bottom corner.
- ch 20.
- In the 3rd ch from hook, make a bobble/puff:
(yo, insert, pull up loop, yo, pull through 2) x 5, yo and pull through all loops, ch 1 to close.

- Fasten off. Repeat on the other side.

Optional purple trim

Join purple yarn and sc evenly around the face opening and bottom edge. Fasten off and weave in ends.

3) B) Earmuffs (Purple) x 2 + Connector

Make two earmuff pads, then connect them with a simple chain headband.

Earmuff pad (make 2)

R1: MR, 6 sc (6)

R2: inc x 6 (12)

R3: (sc, inc) x 6 (18) R4: BLO hdc 18 (18).

Fasten off for each pad.

Connector (headband)

Join yarn to one pad: ch 22 (adjust to fit your hood). Sew/attach the other end to the second pad.

Optional clean border + attach

With yarn, sc around the outer edge of each pad for a neat finish. Sew earmuffs onto the hood sides.

4) C) Overalls (Purple) with Pocket + Straps



Waist ring

R1: ch 40, join into a ring (40)

R2: ch2 (not counted), dc in same st, dc around, sl st (40)

R3: ch2 (not counted), dc in same st, dc around, sl st (40)

Fit tip: waist too tight/loose - change ch 40 to ch 38 or ch 42 (keep even).

Legs (split into two sections)

Place markers: 20 sts front + 20 sts back.

Leg 1 (on one 20-st section)

Leg R1: ch2 (not counted), dc 20, join (20)

Leg R2: ch2, dc 20, join (20) Leg R3: ch2, dc 20, join (20). Fasten off.

Leg 2 (on the other 20 sts)

Leg R1: ch2 (not counted), dc 20, join (20)

Leg R2: ch2, dc 20, join (20)

Leg R3: ch2, dc 20, join (20). Fasten off.

Optional cuff: join yarn and sc around each leg opening once.

Front bib (purple)

Join yarn at front center above the legs.

Bib Row 1: ch2, dc 10, turn

Bib Row 2: ch2, dc 10, turn Bib

Row 3: ch2, dc 10. Fasten off.

Pocket (white)

ch 6 Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and across = 5 sc, turn

Row 2: ch1, sc 5, turn Row 3:

ch1, sc 5. Fasten off. Sew

pocket centered on bib.

Straps x 2 (purple)

Attach yarn to the top corner of the bib.

Strap: ch 18-22 (adjust length to reach the back waistband comfortably).

Option A (thin): fasten off and sew to back waistband.

Option B (thicker + buttonhole):

Work back down the chain with sc, starting in 2nd ch from hook, until 2 chains remain. Buttonhole: ch 2, skip 2 chains, sl st in the last chain (or sc in last chain).

Fasten off and sew strap to back waistband.

Reinforce the hole: sl st around the ch-2 space once.

Sizing: bigger button - ch 3, skip 3. Smaller - ch 1, skip 1.

Add 2 small buttons on the bib corners (or sew straps directly).

Quick fit adjustments

- Waist too tight/loose: change ch 40 to ch 38 / 42 (keep even).
- Legs too short/long: add/remove 1 dc round per leg.
- Straps: adjust chain length +/- 2-4 chains.



5) Minimal-sew options

- Skip the pocket for a clean, fast finish (bib still looks cute).
- Use tie straps instead of buttons: make each strap longer (+6 to +10 chains) and tie at the back waistband.
- Earmuffs need only a few small stitches to secure; keep stitches tight and neat.

6) Color variations (easy swaps)



- Classic: purple overalls + earmuffs with white hood and pocket.
- Red/Coral pop: swap purple yarn for red/coral (same stitch counts).
- Cozy neutral: all-cream set, then add small contrast trim or pom-poms.
- Two-tone: change only the cuffs/trim for a premium finished look.

7) Troubleshooting + quick sizing

- Hood too tight: use a bigger hook (3.5 mm) or crochet looser. If needed, add one more increase round after R4.
- Hood too loose: use a smaller hook (3.0 mm) or stop at R3 and test fit before R4.
- Ear holes misaligned: adjust ear hole chains (ch 4 smaller, ch 6 bigger) and re-check skip counts.
- Waist too tight/loose: change ch 40 to ch 38 or ch 42 (keep even).

- Leg length: add/remove one dc round per leg.
- Straps: adjust length +/- 2-4 chains; reinforce buttonhole with sl st around the hole.
